## **Active Projects**

University of St. Augustine, San Marcos California Campus, Susan MacDermott, OTD, OTR/L

Since Fall, 2016 over 150 FW Level I students have been collaborating with CoreCivic Ocean View Facility in San Diego, CA (previously Correctional Alternatives Inc.) In a fieldwork experience embedded within the "Clinical Applications of Occupational Therapy in Psychosocial and Community Settings" course they completed an interview, COPM, and one additional assessment (Allen's Cognitive Level Screen and Adolescent/ Adult Sensory Profile) with a resident. The students then return the following week and deliver general recommendations regarding programming, environment, and transition planning to the case managers.

The first entry level OTD student will start their capstone experience exploring "Identifying Opportunities for the Role of OT in a Correctional Facility" in April, 2019 where they will be conducting a needs assessment at the facility with a focus on program development. A 2<sup>nd</sup> OTD student will follow this capstone in August, 2019-December, 2019 to continue program development and implementation.

Dr. White reports having two Doctoral Capstone students who will be working in Forensicare in Melbourne. One of their projects is to work with Lorrae Mynnard to contribute to an OT in CJ scope of practice document.
